

We are thankful to God for all that he gives us here at the Children's Center. We have been lucky to have great staff that provides a fun and spiritual environment for the children who

attend our program.

October is Fire Prevention Month which will be our major theme for the center. We will teach the children fire safety, preventative techniques, and talk about fire drills to keep them safe. On October 13, we will have firefighters from the Croom Rd. Fire Department come and speak with the children while showing them the tools they need to fight fires. Providing hands-on experiences for the children helps solidify the knowledge they gain in the classroom.

Now is a great time to check the date on your smoke alarms (they should be replaced every 10 years), place fire extinguishers at every level of your home, and install carbon monoxide alarms on each floor and near bedrooms.

October 14th, we start at 5:30 AM. Breakfast is served until 9 AM.

Please bring your food donations to church with you on Sunday, October 8th. These are our staple items: pasta noodles, rice, spaghetti sauce, canned vegetables, canned beans, canned protein, jelly, cereal, macaroni & cheese.

For October, our volunteer schedule is:

- Truck Unloading, Wed, October 11th. (11:30 am to 3:30 pm, sometimes earlier)
- Sorting Thu, October 12th @ 7pm
- Bagging Fri, October 13th @ 8am
- Distribution Sat, October 14th @ 7am

We really need help on Wednesday, October 11th unloading the truck. Hand trucks are provided. The delivery driver unloads the delivery truck and we must cart the boxes using the hand trucks from the driveway up a ramp and inside the fellowship hall at Trinity. It goes fast and we usually have everything inside in a half hour to forty-five minutes with 3 volunteers.

GIFT IDEAS

TOYS: small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch A Sketch®, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky®, etc.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

HYGIENE ITEMS: toothbrush, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

OTHER: T-shirts, socks, ball caps; sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries)

It's easy for us to read this story and hear a message of equality, justice, and fairness. We deal with these issues in the work world every day. Those who do more deserve a greater reward, right?

Jesus brings that calculation into his kingdom and turns it on its head! Those who figure on their accomplishments, attendance, ideas, and merit to secure their place in God's good graces are shocked—like the first group of laborers hired! Jesus will have nothing to do with the Grand Bargain: "You do something good, like walking for cancer, giving money to church, or being nice to a difficult relative/neighbor, and God is in your debt."

The landowner doesn't reward any laborers on the basis of their performance. It is from the grace in his heart that the reward is calculated. And so it will be in heaven. We can never put Jesus in our debt. He willingly went to the cross in our place and endured hell for us. Our offenses and the record of our sin are much worse than we are prepared to admit, and greater than our goodness. Only humility and repentance can break open the fountains of God's free grace!

So, dear worshiper, as you come near to the kingdom of heaven today, what will you do? Will you stubbornly follow the Grand Bargain, and work yourself to death trying to put God in your debt? Or will you throw your efforts away by faith, and trust that when Jesus died on the cross, he died for you, and that every offense, rebellion, idol, and sin on your record has been wiped clean forever?

One way leads to pride and to slavery. One way leads to the death of pride and to freedom. Choose wisely!
