We really need help on Wednesday, November 8th unloading the truck. We know have free produce delivered on Wednesday along with our regular food order. Hand trucks are provided. The delivery driver unloads the delivery truck and we only have to cart the boxes using the hand trucks from the driveway up a ramp and inside the fellowship hall at Trinity. It goes pretty fast and we are usually have everything inside in a half hour to forty-five minutes with 3 volunteers.

They will be emailed a code. To complete registration, they must go back to the website and type in their code and name.

TOYS: small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch A Sketch®, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky®, etc.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

HYGIENE ITEMS: toothbrush, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.
