HVAC UPDATE

The Board of Trustees would like to thank everyone for their understanding and patience as we diligently work towards replacing the HVAC system (particularly the air conditioning) in the sanctuary. This type of project takes much consideration and coordination, but we are "getting there" and have made significant progress in the past 3 months. We have hired an independent engineer (Capital Engineering Group, LLC) to draw up the necessary specifications. Joint Board members were able to meet with the engineer on May 15, 2019, to better understand the technical aspects of the project and to ask questions. The great news is that the engineer's scope of effort includes: assisting us in identifying potential bidders (which is now complete), reviewing each bidder's proposal, making a final decision as to which contracting company will do the work, and lastly, ensuring that the work is done properly. Proposals are due June 20, 2019 (in a few weeks) and we anticipate the HVAC project to be completed by the Aug/Sept timeframe, so pray for a kind summer!!! Again, the trustees appreciate your continuing support.
