SHOE BOX TIME ~ 2019

The Samaritan's Purse project Operation Christmas Child collects shoebox gifts-filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items-and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, has collected and delivered more than 168 million shoebox gifts to children in more than 160 countries and territories. In 2019, Operation Christmas Child hopes to collect enough shoebox gifts to reach another 11 million children in countries like Peru, the Philippines, Rwanda and Ukraine. More than 10.6 million shoebox gifts were collected worldwide in 2018, with more than 8.8 million collected in the U.S. Process:

Anyone can pack a shoebox. Individuals, families, churches and groups fill empty shoeboxes with school supplies, hygiene items and fun toys, such as dolls or soccer balls. During National Collection Week (Nov. 18 – 25, 2019), Samaritan's Purse will collect the gift-filled shoeboxes at nearly 5,000 drop-off locations in all 50 states and Puerto Rico. Learn how to pack a shoebox, view gift suggestions, and get other information at samaritanspurse.org/occ. Participants can donate \$9 per shoebox gift online through Follow Your Box and receive a tracking label to discover its destination. Participants who prefer the convenience of online shopping can browse samaritanspurse.org/buildonline to select gifts matched to a child's specific age and gender, then finish packing the virtual shoebox by adding a photo and personal note of encouragement. Shoebox gifts are prepared for overseas shipment at eight major processing centers across the U.S.— Atlanta; Baltimore/Washington; Boone, North Carolina: Charlotte, North Carolina: Dallas/Fort Worth; Denver; Chicago; and Fullerton, California. Scope:

Shoebox gifts are collected in the U.S., Canada, the U.K., Australia, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Finland, Spain, New Zealand and Japan.

Nearly 500,000 volunteers worldwide—with more than 150,000 of those in the U.S.—are involved in collecting, shipping and distributing shoebox gifts. Eternal Impact

Delivered into the hands of children through local churches, every shoebox gift is an opportunity to share about Jesus Christ and God's love. Since 2010, more than 14 million children who have received a shoebox gift have participated in The Greatest Journey—a 12-lesson discipleship program. Children learn from trained, local volunteers what it means to follow Jesus and share their faith with friends and family.

TREASURER'S CORNER

For the current fiscal year, we continue to run a deficit. A comparison of revenue and expenses for fiscal years 2018 and 2019 through October, respectively, is set forth below:

2019	\$256,168	\$268,516	-\$12,348


*Includes \$14,300 from investments deposited into operating account. Revenue without the \$14,300 was \$242,440.

Each Sunday, the amount of general offering for the previous Sunday is reported under the heading "Offering and Attendance." About 75% of our annual budget revenue is from general offerings. As a benchmark, general offerings should be about \$4,360 per week. The general offerings received in October are set forth below:

For the 2019 fiscal year ending October 27, 2019, the total general offerings received and counted were \$176,202.06. The amount projected was \$182,000.00.

Current fiscal year benevolences by St. Paul's and its members total \$16,554.23. Donations to the Marlboro Food Bank through October total \$7,320.00, of which \$850.00 was donated in memory of Ina Bolton, former food bank coordinator.
