Restricted Income is income designated for a particular use or purpose, e.g., building maintenance, flowers, donations to permanent church funds, pass-through donations, etc. All other income is unrestricted. Pass-through donations are donations to third parties outside the church, e.g., Food Bank, No Room At The Inn, etc., that are forwarded to the third party as a donation. A negative (in red) net income minus expenses means that the church is operating with a deficit.
